Shoo the Flu & Pneumonia Too!!

Front Range Flu Shots, LLC, will be providing flu & pneumococcal immunizations here at the Town Hall.

FRONT RANGE FLU SHOTS' POLICIES & INSURANCE COVERAGE:

Flu Shot

- Age policy: Must be 4 years or older to receive a flu shot
- Insurance: No cost for those covered by the following insurance plans: Medicare Part B or Railroad Medicare Part B (when your primary insurance plan), Humana (except Humana One & PDP), Rocky Mountain Health Plans, Secure Horizons, or Sloans Lake/Cofinity. Insurance card must be presented.

Pneumococcal Shot

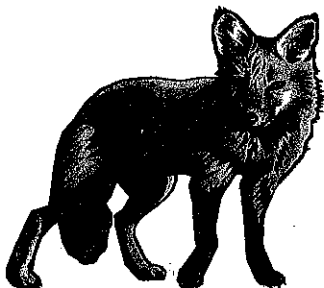
- Age policy: Must be 18 years or older to receive a pneumonia shot.
- Insurance: If Medicare Part B or Railroad Medicare Part B is your primary insurance, or you have Sloans Lake/Cofinity insurance, ask the nurse if you are eligible for a pneumococcal shot at no cost when insurance card is presented.

*FluMist Nasal Spray (upon availability) age policy:

- FluMist is available to healthy individuals ages 4-49 years who are not pregnant.

NO PARKING OVERNIGHT

The Town of Columbine Valley has an ordinance regarding overnight parking. **THERE IS NO OVERNIGHT PARKING BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 3:00 AM TO 6:00 AM.** Be certain you & your guests are aware of this ordinance as parking tickets will be issued. If you must park overnight, call the Town office & you will receive a temporary permit to park.

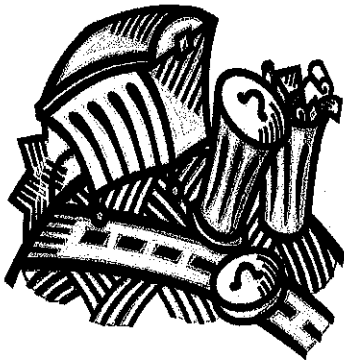


Please remember coyotes are wild animals & should never be fed. Do not approach pups, adults rarely abandon their young. Coyote parents are good parents. Coyotes can lose their fear of people & will kill cats and dogs. Keep your pets on a leash when walking them & do not leave them unattended, especially at night. Do not leave pet food outside. Keep your garbage in a tightly sealed container & out of reach of all animals.

If you meet a coyote, you can throw rocks & use a loud, authoritative voice to scare them away. As always, pay attention to your surroundings & whenever possible keep your distance.

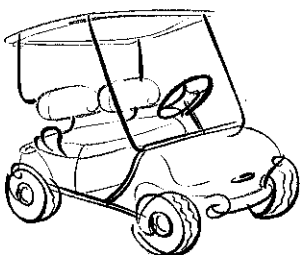
Annual Fall Clean-up

The Town encourages all residents to take advantage of the large trash dumpsters being brought in November 1 thru November 3. Dumpsters will be placed in the swimming pool parking lot at the entrance off Fairway, & another one in the tennis court parking lot at Burning Tree. Allied Waste will bring the dumpster Thursday mid-afternoon, November 1 & pick them up by noon Saturday, November 3. Please, as always, **NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS.** Many common products found in your home such as oil-based paint, mercury, gasoline, degreaser, cleaning compounds & garden chemicals may be hazardous & they should be used & disposed of properly. You may call Arapahoe County Disposal Service, for Littleton, at (303) 795-3834. For more information you can look on the internet for Tri-County Health Department at www.tchd.org & click on "Environmental Health Services" & then go to "Household Chemical Roundup".

Please do not put electronics, refrigerators or other major appliances in or around the dumpsters. You may call the Town office for these items. We have a recycler who will take most anything away you no longer need. The Town office will be the collection site but please call first to ensure the items you have are eligible for this program.

R.A.D. Systems—Rape Against Defense Systems

Golf Cart Rules

Golf carts may be driven by persons under the age of 16 if accompanied by a person 16 years of age or older & must have a headlight for night operation; electric & gas scooters are not allowed in Columbine Valley & will be strictly enforced; motorized bicycles under 50cc may only be driven by a valid licensed driver & anything over 50cc requires a valid motorcycle license & must have a valid license plate. We have had several complaint regarding these issues & intend to strictly enforce these ordinances.
