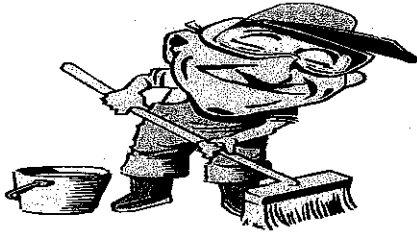

Annual Spring Clean Up

It's spring time and that means "dumpster days are here again". The trash dumpsters will be brought in May 17th through May 19th. One will be placed in the tennis court parking lot at the Country Club and another one in the tennis court parking lot at Burning Tree. Allied Waste will deliver the dumpsters Thursday early afternoon

and pick them up mid-afternoon Saturday. The rules are the same, **NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS**. Many common products found in your home such as oil-based paint, mercury, gasoline, degreasers, cleaning compounds and garden chemicals may be hazardous and they should be used and disposed of properly. You may call Arapahoe County Disposal Service, for Littleton, at (303) 795-3834. Please do not put electronics, refrigerators or other major appliances in or around the dumpsters. For these items, please see the article "Electronic Recycling" on the back of this newsletter.

R.A.D. Systems—Rape Aggression Defense

The Rape Aggression Defense System is a program of realistic, self defense tactics & techniques. It is a comprehensive course for women that begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction & avoidance.

The R.A.D. Systems is dedicated to teaching women defensive concepts & techniques against various types of assault.

This course is taught by Officer Dan Hyde who is a certified R.A.D. instructor. The course will be held at the Columbine Valley Town Hall & is free to Columbine Valley and Bow Mar residents. For non-residents, there is a fee of \$25.

Please remember coyotes are wild animals & should never be fed. Do not approach pups, adults rarely abandon their young. Coyote parents are good parents.

Coyotes can lose their fear of people & will kill cats & dogs. Keep your pets on a leash when walking them and do not leave them unattended, especially at night. Do not leave pet food outside. Keep your garbage in a tightly sealed container & out of reach of all animals.

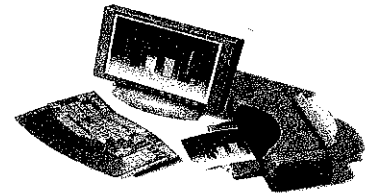
If you meet a coyote, you can throw rocks and use a loud, authoritative voice to scare them away. As always, pay attention to your surroundings & whenever possible keep your distance.
