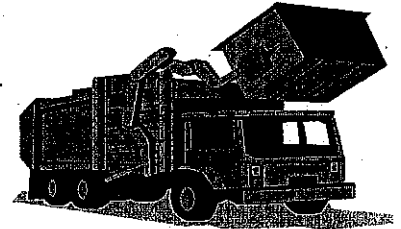

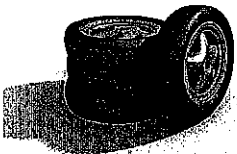
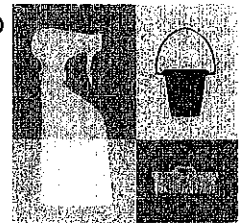
Be sure to mark your calendar and join your neighbors in celebrating 50 years in our "special neighborhood".

SPRING CLEAN-UP

It is spring time & that means "dumpster days are here again". The trash dumpsters will be brought in on May 14th at noon & picked up at noon on May 16th. They will be in the usual places, one at the pool parking lot in Burning Tree and the other in the tennis court/pool parking lot at the Columbine Country Club.



The rules remain the same but bear repeating, **NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS**. Many common household cleaning products, paints, pesticides, even motor oil, can post a threat to your family and the environment. Even small amounts of these wastes, when disposed of improperly, can pollute ground or surface water and can put humans and animals at risk. If you have hazardous recyclables, you can go to www.colorado-recycles.org and click on "Search for a Recycler". You will find many resources to help dispose of your wastes properly and safely.



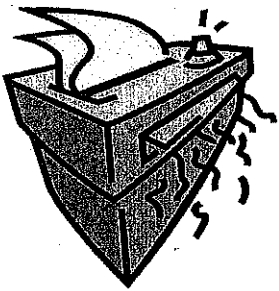
Tires, car batteries (lead-acid batteries) should never be disposed of in your home trash container or dumpster, or poured into any type of drain. These materials can be easily recycled. Most automotive shops (Checker Auto Parts or Pep Boys) accept car batteries & used motor oil for recycling at no charge. Car tires may be recycled at tire shops when you purchase new tires.

We still have the recycler who will take electronics & most any furniture. Call the Town office for more information.
