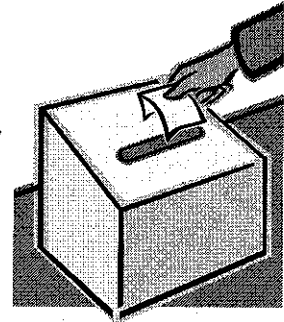
H1N1 FLU CLINIC



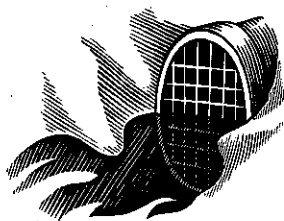
Now that national shortages of the H1N1 vaccine have eased, Tri-County Health Department is encouraging everyone to receive an H1N1 vaccination. So the Town has engaged Front Range Flu Clinics to host a clinic to give the H1N1 vaccine on January 14, 2010 from 9:30 am to 11:30 am in the Town Hall at 2 Middlefield Road. The vaccine is now available to everyone. The cost is \$15 for the shot. Front Range is the same people that provide our seasonal flu clinics in the fall every year.

MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Three Trustee positions and the Mayor position will be open in April 2010. Trustee terms are for four years with a two term limit and the Mayor term is for two years with a two term limit. Nomination petitions will be available February 15, 2010 for anyone wishing to be a candidate. 6100 CHANNEL



Construction work has begun (after 15 years of discussion) to revise this drainage way flowing from west to east, under Platte Canyon, through the Equestrian Center and into Nevada Ditch. This construction will divert the 6100 Channel flow south to Cooley Lake, lessening the Nevada Ditch over flow down Fairway Lane. The following entities have come to agreement and are funding the project: Urban Drainage & Flood Control District, City of Littleton, City of Englewood, Town of

Columbine Valley and the shareholders of the Nevada Ditch Company. Wild Plum Farm has donated land for this project.

COLORADO CELL PHONE/TEXT MESSAGING LAW



For drivers **18 years of age and older**, wireless telephones may not be used for text messaging or other similar forms of manual data entry or transmission.

Drivers **under 18 years of age** may not use wireless telephones for any purpose. Exceptions are provided for persons using a phone during an emergency or to contact a public safety entity.

Violations of this law are punishable by a class A traffic infraction and a \$50 fine.

Subsequent violations incur a class A traffic infraction and a \$100 fine.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

There is no overnight parking in the Town of Columbine Valley between the hours of 3:00 am to 6:00 am and there are signs posted at all entrances to the Town. If you must park on the street overnight, call the Town office for a permit. If you need a permit before or after the Town Hall hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm or on weekends, please call Arapahoe County Dispatch at (303) 795-4711 and ask for a Columbine Valley Police officer to notify them that you will need a permit to park overnight. Please be certain your guests are made aware of this ordinance so that embarrassing and annoying "No Parking" tickets can be avoided.
