Communications & Administration

- The Town's new website launched on Monday the 18th. There are several new features including the "Updates" tab, a more robust Calendar feature and a new Public Works section. Still to come will be an interactive Town Map page and additional content updates.
- The Master Plan update has now started, and the first outreach effort, the Vision Survey, has been completed with an 18% response rate! Additional outreach will continue with an open house on February 20th and two additional open houses on March 20 and in May.
- Sponsorship commitments are coming in and arrangements for the 4th of July, Summer Concerts in the Park and the Towns' 60th anniversary celebration are underway. The Concert performers will be announced in March with some amazing bands anticipated for 2019.

- Two failing battery backups were replaced for the phone system and a town computer. The backup generator received its yearly maintenance service, passing all tests. All ash trees have been scheduled for their second year of Emerald Ash Borer treatment.
- During snow plowing, the Tahoe blew out an oil seal, draining all oil from the car and temporarily seizing the engine. After towing the truck back to Town Hall, repairs were made to the engine and oil system. The Tahoe was back in service for the next snow storm. A new steel cutting edge was installed on the F350 providing more effective clearing capability.
- Public Works will take possession of the old CVPD Expedition at the end of February. It is being decommissioned and stripped of the police lights and livery and having public works markings applied. Once back at Town Hall, the plow equipment will be installed. The Tahoe will be decommissioned at the conclusion of this snow season.
- The first year of street light replacement was wrapped up. Two concrete light poles were replaced that had sever internal and external cracking and tilting. New fiberglass poles were installed in their place and included new LED lights with better directed light angles. Two more new poles will be installed in 2019.
- January received a substantial increase in snowfall. Multiple plow drivers were used, along with all three pieces of plowing equipment. The new sidewalk along Platte Canyon running between Hunter Run and Doral has now been added to the list of sidewalks that the town plows. A comparison was run between plowing parking lots with the Tahoe vs the John Deere Gator. The Tahoe has traditionally been used to clear the parking lots, but the new Gator is much more agile, and outperforming the Tahoe. The Gator will now be the vehicle of choice for parking lots as well as sidewalks.

Wild Plum Farm

On site work continues to progress with landscaping work anticipated to advance rapidly this spring. That will include more paths and trails, irrigation and plantings, along with hardscape features such as monument signs, pergolas, fire pits and the play area.

Fairway lane water infrastructure work has concluded, but the widening effort is on hold until late March or April when asphalt work resumes throughout the metro area. This has left the residents living on and utilizing Fairway Lane on a semi-patched road that is less than ideal. The Town continues to work with citizens and the developer to maintain the best conditions possible under the circumstances.
