### **Town Administration**

Hunter Run Lane Traffic Light

**Study.** As directed by the Trustees at the May meeting, Town Staff has started a safety review of Hunter Run Lane in preparation for a decision on removing the traffic light. The study will include speed, traffic counts, sightlines, pedestrian crossing, and recommendations for next steps. The presentation is scheduled for the July Board of Trustees meeting.

**Safety Steps.** As part of the Town's emphasis on safety this summer, the Police Department hosted Scooter & Bike Safety Training at Columbine Country Club on June 8. A dozen kids showed up in helmets, enjoyed ice cream, showed off their skills, chatted with officers, and had plenty of fun. 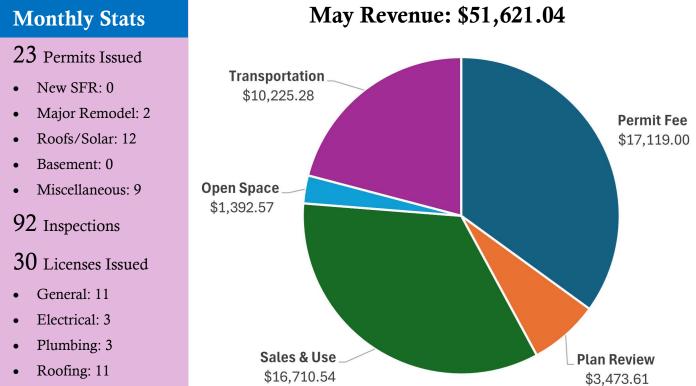

- 3. Asphalt binder top layer

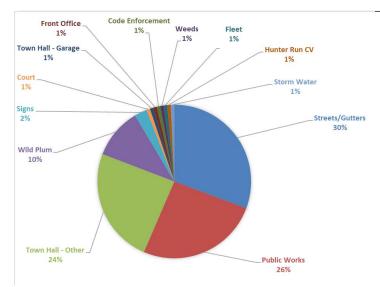

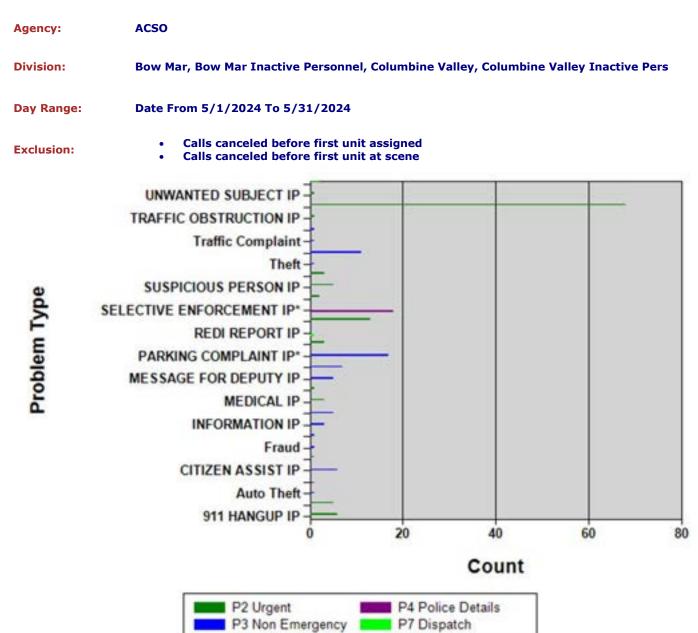

The benefits of participating in this national program include reduced cost flood insurance for residential structures and hazard mapping support from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The Urban Drainage and Flood Control District (UDFCD) works with FEMA to update and maintain hazard mapping to reflect current conditions on a recurring basis (about every 10 years). In February and March of 2024 the Town updated its ordinance related to damage. Upon submitting that update to the state, one definition was found to be missing. This ordinance corrects that oversite.

#### A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF COLUMBINE VALLEY CONCERNING FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF COLUMBINE VALLEY, COLORADO, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 15.36.070 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Columbine Valley is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

#### Section 15.36.070. Basis For Establishing The Areas Of Special Flood Hazard.

The areas of special flood hazard identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in a scientific and engineering report entitled, "The Flood Insurance Study for Arapahoe County, Colorado and Incorporated Areas," effective April 11, 2024, with accompanying Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) and any revisions thereto are hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this ordinance. These Special Flood Hazard Areas identified by the FIS and attendant mapping are the minimum area of applicability of this Ordinance and may be supplemented by studies designated and approved by the Town of Columbine Valley. The Floodplain Administrator shall keep a copy of the Flood Insurance Study (FIS), DFIRMs and/or FIRMs on file and available for public inspection.

Section 2. Should any section clause, sentence, part or portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by any court to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or portion declared by such court to be unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 3. The Town Clerk shall certify the passage of this Ordinance and cause notice of its contents and passage to be published.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the expiration of thirty (30) days after the publication of this Ordinance in the Littleton Independent, Littleton, Colorado, said newspaper being a weekly newspaper duly qualified for publishing legal notices and advertisements within the meaning of the laws of the State of Colorado.

- (4) Individually listed on a local inventory or historic places in communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either:
  - a. By an approved state program as determined by the Secretary of the Interior; or
  - b. Directly by the Secretary of the Interior in states without approved programs.

Letter of map revision (LOMR) means FEMA's official revision of an effective flood insurance rate map (FIRM), or flood boundary and floodway map (FBFM), or both. LOMRs are generally based on the implementation of physical measures that affect the hydrologic or hydraulic characteristics of a flooding source and thus result in the modification of the existing regulatory floodway, the effective base flood elevations (BFEs), or the special flood hazard area (SFHA).

Letter of map revision based on fill (LOMR-F) means FEMA's modification of the special flood hazard area (SFHA) shown on the flood insurance rate map (FIRM) based on the placement of fill outside the existing regulatory floodway.

*Levee* means a man-made structure, usually an earthen embankment, designed and constructed in accordance with sound engineering practices to contain, control, or divert the flow of water so as to provide protection from temporary flooding.

*Levee system* means a flood protection system which consists of a levee and associated structures, such as closure and drainage devices, which are constructed and operated in accordance with sound engineering practices.

*Lowest floor* means the lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area (including basement). An unfinished or flood resistant enclosure, usable solely for parking or vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement area is not considered a building's lowest floor, provided that such enclosure is not built so as to render the structure in violation of the applicable non-elevation design requirement of Section 60.3 of the National Flood insurance Program regulations.

*Manufactured home* means a structure transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities. The term "manufactured home" does not include a recreational vehicle.

*Manufactured home park or subdivision* means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.

*Mean sea level* means, for purposes of the National Flood Insurance Program, the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929 or other datum, to which base flood elevations shown on a community's flood insurance rate map are referenced.

*New construction* means, for the purpose of determining insurance rates, structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of an initial FIRM or after December 31, 1974, whichever is later, and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures. For floodplain management purposes, the term "new construction" means structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of a floodplain management regulation adopted by a community and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures.

*New manufactured home park or subdivision* means a manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including, at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed on or after the effective date of floodplain management regulations adopted by a community.

*Recreational vehicle* means a vehicle which is:

(1) Built on a single chassis;

- (2) 400 square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projections;
- (3) Designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light-duty truck; and

(4) Designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use.
INSERT:

Start of construction (for other than new construction or substantial improvements under the Coastal Barrier SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD AREA - The land in the Resources Act (Pub. L. 97-348)), includes substantial improvement floodplain within a community subject to a one percent issued, provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction improvement was within 180 days of the permit date. The term "actual start means either the last nace of flooding in any given year, i.e., permanent construction of a structure on a site, such as the pouring of slab or footings, the instance of the structure of a s of piles, the construction of columns, or any work beyond the stage of excavation; or the placement of a manufactured home a foundation. The term "permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling: nor does it include the installation of streets and/or walkways; nor does it include excavation for basement. footings, piers or foundations or the erection of temporary forms; nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not part of the main structure. For a substantial improvement, the term "actual start of construction" means the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of a building, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building.

*Structure* means a walled and roofed building, including a gas or liquid storage tank that is principally above ground, as well as a manufactured home.

*Substantial damage* means damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to its before-damaged condition would equal or exceed 50 percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

Substantial improvement means any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds 50 percent of the market value of the structure before start of construction of the improvement. This includes structures which have incurred substantial damage, regardless of the actual repair work performed. The term "substantial improvement" does not, however, include either:

- (1) Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of State or local health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local code enforcement official and which are the minimum necessary conditions; or
- (2) Any alteration of a historic structure, provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a historic structure.

*Variance* is a grant of relief to a person from the requirement of this chapter when specific enforcement would result in unnecessary hardship. A variance, therefore, permits construction or development in a manner otherwise prohibited by this chapter. (For full requirements, see Section 60.6 of the National Flood Insurance Program regulations.)

*Violation* means the failure of a structure or other development to be fully compliant with the community's floodplain management regulations. A structure or other development without the elevation certificate, other certifications, or other evidence of compliance required in Section 60.3(b)(5), (c)(4), (c)(10), (d)(3), (e)(2), (e)(4), or (e)(5) of the model State Floodplain Damage Prevention Ordinance, established by the State Water Conservation Board in 2011, is presumed to be in violation until such time as that documentation is provided.

*Water surface elevation* means the height, in relation to the National Geodetic American Vertical Datum (NAVD) of 1988 (or other datum, where specified), of floods of various magnitudes and frequencies in the floodplains of coastal or riverine areas.

#### Sec. 15.36.060. Lands to which this chapter applies.

This chapter shall apply to all areas of special flood hazard and areas removed from the floodplain by the issuance of a FEMA letter of map revision based on fill (LOMR-F) within the jurisdiction of the Town.

#### A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF COLUMBINE VALLEY CONCERNING REFUSE COLLECTION

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF COLUMBINE VALLEY, COLORADO, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 8.16.030 is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

Section 8.16.030. Contract.

A. The Board of Trustees may enter into an exclusive contract agreement with any person or entity for the collection and disposal of ashes, trash, garbage, rubbish, waste matter, and other non-hazardous solid waste materials (including recyclables), hereinafter referred to as Waste Materials, throughout the Town or it may at its discretion make provision for the collection and disposal of Waste Materials.

B. The Waste Materials shall not contain any hazardous materials, wastes or substances, toxic substances, wastes, pollutants, contaminants, infectious wastes, medical wastes, or radioactive wastes, hereinafter referred to as Excluded Waste.

C. Any person who includes Excluded Waste in the deposit of Waste Materials shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Town from and against any and all claims, damages, suits, penalties, fines, remediation costs and liabilities (including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees) resulting from the inclusion of Excluded Waste in the Waste Materials.

Section 2. Should any section clause, sentence, part or portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by any court to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or portion declared by such court to be unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 3. The Town Clerk shall certify the passage of this Ordinance and cause notice of its contents and passage to be published.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the expiration of thirty (30) days after the publication of this Ordinance in the Littleton Independent, Littleton, Colorado said newspaper being a weekly newspaper duly qualified for publishing legal notices and advertisements within the meaning of the laws of the State of Colorado.
