## OPERATING A GOLF CART

Golf cart drivers must follow all driver's license regulations, rules of the road, and traffic signs—including stopping at STOP signs.

A rolling stop or failure to stop at a STOP sign is a moving violation that may result in:

- A 4-point ticket
- A fine up to \$195
- The possibility of raised insurance rates

## UNDERAGE DRIVERS

Golf cart drivers must be 16 years old with a valid driver's license. If an underage child is caught driving a golf cart, expect the following:

- A parent or legal guardian must pick up the child and golf cart.
- If the golf cart cannot be picked up in a reasonable time, it may be towed.
- A ticket, mandatory municipal court date, and a possible fine may result.

## BIKES & SCOOTERS

Children zipping around at high speeds on e-bikes and scooters—often without following traffic rules or watching for cars—is a significant safety concern for Town residents.

While the Town does not currently regulate e-toys, the Board of Trustees is aware of the residents' increasing concern and will continue to monitor and evaluate all options, including banning their use in Columbine Valley.

# LPS BUS STOPS

The Littleton Public Schools bus stops for 2025 are the same as last year. Everything on wheels—cars, golf carts, bikes, and scooters—must stop for buses with flashing red lights.

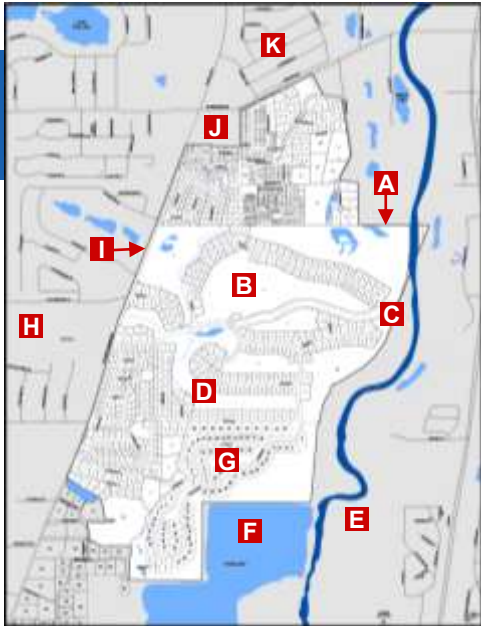

# JURISDICTIONS

The Town of Columbine Valley’s beautiful setting—with its trails, waterways, golf course, and views—is serviced by various jurisdictions. In some areas, it can be hard to tell whether you’re in Columbine Valley or Littleton, whether an area is serviced by the Town or South Suburban Parks & Recreation District, and whether you’re in a public space, on an HOA property, or on country club grounds. Jurisdictions are complicated and it can be difficult to state exactly who does what.
